




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Save The New York Central Electric Locomotives!



In June 2013, the Danbury Railway Museum took ownership of two historic electric locomotives located in the town of Glenmont, NY, near Albany – an S-1 and a T3a. Both were built by ALCO and GE in the early 20th century and are representative of early American third-rail electric motive power.

The S-1 is the first electric locomotive built for the New York Central Railroad in 1904; it was a prototype of all the S-series locomotives and is the only S-1 ever built.

The T3a was built in 1926 for the New York Central and is the only one remaining. Both locomotives handled trains in and out of Grand Central Terminal in New York City.

Both locomotives are land-locked on private property. A road must be built in order to retrieve them, and adds to the overall cost of transportation to the Museum and restoration.

From a store front on Ives Street and no equipment to a restored train station and equipment in the yard, the Museum made a lot of progress in its first ten years. The first event being planned was a fundraising banquet to be held at the Stony Hill Inn located in Bethel. Jack Swanberg graciously agreed to be the after dinner speaker.

It was becoming more and more obvious that a building was needed for storage of equipment and restoration work. At the time a three stall structure was envisioned that would allow members to work year round in maintaining the collection of rolling stock.

Sperry Rail Car #135 arrived in the yard following its donation by Sperry. In excellent shape, it was envisioned as being a permanent display on Sperry.

A marketing plan was put in place with Metro-North Railroad that would include the Museum in their brochures for One Day Getaways. Happy holiday greetings have been passed around the DRM and it is now time to extend those same greetings to our extended membership family out of convenient commuting range. 2013 has left us with the stipulation that we make great New Year's resolutions! If you did, have you broken them yet? The truth! Unfortunately, we lost too many active members in 2013 including long time member Dave Wilson.

In 2013, we were successful with many projects - some new and others with great progress and historical significance. Our trip to Grand Central Terminal in May including the sharing of five pieces of our displayed locomotive and cars were probably the highlight of the year. Work continued on the New York Central caboose, the *Tonawanda Valley* Observation car, which was also to be featured in an upcoming Travel Channel video, the 1455 steam Locomotive, Rutland ride-on flat car, and the turntable. Work continued with progress and funding on the Burro Crane and the initiation of painting of two Canadian National locomotives. We continued participation in numerous outreach programs such as hosting the visits of 700 elementary school students and their teachers, and enhanced our Easter, Pumpkin Patch, and Santa events. The Museum made numerous acquisitions through donations and gifts. The Museum was the site of movie, wedding and engagement shoots, CD cover shoots, music videos, tours, new and expanded Wednesday night programs, and birthday parties. We continued the active pursuit of the two sequestered electric locomotives in Albany (stay tuned on these). Unfortunately, a few projects did not come to fruition in 2013, but we'll continue. We did focus on the new Round House funding and planning in 2013 and hope 2014 will bring us closer to a work facility.

Even in a marginal economy the Danbury Railway Museum has continued to grow economically through innovative programming, careful and frugal spending, and efficient project management. 

Danbury Railway Museum at Annual Amherst Railway Society's Railroad Hobby Show

Over the weekend of January 25th & 26th, 2014, the Danbury Railway Museum took part in the annual railroad hobby show put on by the Amherst Railway Society held at the Eastern States Exposition Fairgrounds in West Springfield Massachusetts. This year, over 21,000 people attended the show! This is the biggest railroad hobby show held in the northeast, which includes vendors and dealers from all over the country selling all sorts of railroad hobby equipment, photos, memorabilia and more. In addition, the show features several large model railroad layouts of all scales and numerous railway historical societies and museums.

Several DRM members made the trek up to West Springfield, MA to see this excellent show. You missed out if you didn't, but I hope you get the chance next year! Visitors to the DRM's booth were pleased with our display and bought several items that were for sale, including models, literature, and other things. People also were able to take home a special four-page color issue of the Railyard Local newsletter specifically printed for the show. "I always liked trains and have visited numerous tourist railroads, including the Valley RR as a teenager when they first occupied the station. It was full of hoops for train orders, cans of date nails, a scissors pull-out telephone on the wall and lots of

Saturday, March 8th

<u>Safety Exam:</u> 10:30 AM. For ALL volunteers working in the yard.

<u>Crew Exam:</u> 1:30 PM. For ALL current and potential crew members.

Saturday, March 15th

<u>Car Host/Tour Guide Training:</u> 10:30 AM. For ALL current and potential car hosts and tour guides before working on DRM trains or giving tours. Will cover duties of each position.

These exams or training sessions are given annually to qualify for each position. Safety of our guests is "Job 1" and the exams or training sessions reinforce the things we need to keep in mind. Please plan to attend.
