# Congresswoman Elizabeth Esty Visits the Danbury Railway Museum

Congresswoman Elizabeth Esty (CT, 5<sup>th</sup> District) visited the Danbury Railway Museum on Thursday, January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2016, along with Jody Trestman, a member of her staff, and State Rep. Bob Godfrey who represents Danbury and is the Deputy Speaker in the Connecticut State Assembly. They were met by President Wade Roese and Vice President Stan Madyda.

The visit included a ride in the railyard on ex-New Haven Railroad Rail Diesel Car #32 with the first stop being the turntable. Engineer Jim Teer and conductor Dave Fuller were the crew for the trip. Similar to what is done at our Danbury Railway Days event, the group was given a half-rotation ride on the turntable and stopped at the plywood "red carpet" leading to the rear platform of the *Tonawanda Valley*. The Congresswoman and her party received a platform-to-vestibule tour of the 1928 observation/lounge/sleeping car by President Roese and others. She was quite impressed with the restoration work that was done.

It was back on the RDC for a return to the boarding point and, under the supervision of engineer Jim Teer, Ms. Esty took the controls for a short distance. The group had planned a forty-five minute visit, but Rep. Esty wanted to check out the Continued on Page 7

#### Saturday, March 12th

<u>Safety Exam:</u> 10:00 AM. For ALL volunteers working in the yard.

<u>Crew Exam:</u> Immediately after safety exam. For ALL current and potential crew members.

## Saturday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>

<u>Car Host/Tour Guide Training:</u> 10:00 AM. For ALL current and potential car hosts and tour guides which must be completed before working on DRM trains or giving tours. Will cover duties of each position.

These exams and training sessions are given annually to qualify for each position. Safety of our guests is "Job One" and the exams or training sessions reinforce the things we need to keep in mind. Please plan to attend them. They will be conducted at the Museum.

## Ten Years Ago

The first quarter of 2006 was a busy time at the Museum. The Santa Trains were again very successful. Many involved with the Santa Trains began planning for the Easter Bunny Trains in April. The Museum hosted a First Night Event and even though it was a snowy night, many people came out to hear live music in the Station and ride the Budd car in the railyard. Visitors to the yard got to see privately owned and fully restored B&O Budd car #1060 and New Haven #162 which arrived in December.

2005 proved to be a very successful year in fundraising with donations totaling over \$36,000 going to specific projects and the general fund. Track work, the RPO car and the New Haven Forge were targeted for major fundraising for 2006.

The Library learned of a large collection of books, photos and railroad-related material that was for sale by a church group in Willimantic. The group received the collection from retired New Haven and Long Island Railroad engineer Harry Vallas. Upon inspection, it was decided that while there would be duplicate material, there would be enough new items to make the purchase worthwhile. A U-Haul truck was rented and more than 100 boxes were moved to the DRM (pictured below). Over time, the sale of duplicate material paid for the cost of the collection.

Most work in the yard had been suspended due to the weather except for the RPO restoration. Some fittings from the car were removed and worked on off-site and replaced, money was being raised for needed window replacements and canvas mail bags (no longer used by the Post Office) were being sourced.




# Parking Deal on Weekends

# Danbury Railway Museum at the Annual Amherst Railway Society's Railroad Hobby Show, By Sue Teer

Over the weekend of January 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016, the Danbury Railway Museum was out in force at the annual Amherst Railway Society railroad hobby show held at the Eastern States Exposition Fairgrounds in West Springfield, Massachusetts. This is the biggest railroad hobby show held in the northeast, which includes vendors and dealers from all over the country selling all sorts of railroad hobby equipment, photos, memorabilia and more. In addition, the show features several large model railroad layouts of all scales and numerous railway historical societies and museums.

There was a good turnout of visitors as the weather was better than the normal winter blast (attendance for the show was a little under 20,000 people!). The Museum had a new photo board display (now on display in our building) thanks to Patty & Don, and we spoke to hundreds of friendly people about our activities, rides and things to see when they visit. We gave out lots of Museum brochures as well as Easter Bunny event flyers. In addition to the gift shop, the library sold books and the modelers sold lots of donated merchandise. We also received a grant of \$1,000 for the EL caboose. Thanks for another great weekend, Amherst Railway Society, and a big thanks to our volunteers who set up, staffed and returned all goods to the Museum that weekend.

# Amherst Railway Society Heritage Grant Awarded to the Danbury Railway Museum for EL Bay Window Caboose

The Amherst Railway Society, Inc. sponsors two annual grant programs intended to further the preservation, renovation, rebuilding and restoration of historical railroad items. The Founders' Award is a single \$10,000 grant to a project, selected by the Board of Directors. The Heritage Grant Program is for lesser amounts, usually below \$4,000, that are distributed to several organizations. The Heritage Grants are awards for smaller projects, or for the partial funding of larger projects that are receiving matching funds from other sources. The funds for these programs are generated by their annual railroad hobby show in January.

On Sunday, January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016, the awards and grants were publicly announced at the Amherst Railway Society's Railroad Hobby Show in West Springfield, MA. Once again, the Danbury Railway Museum was the recipient of a heritage grant in the amount of \$1,000. This was awarded to the DRM specifically for the 1970 Erie-Lackawanna bay window caboose that the Museum has just recently taken possession of. President Wade Roese and Treasurer Patty Osmer were on hand to receive the check and certificate of this most generous award (pictured below right with DRM grant committee chair, Secretary Steve Gould standing inbetween them). On behalf of the Danbury Railway Museum, we would like to thank Amherst's board of directors and their president, Bruce MacCullagh (pictured below left with Patty and Wade), for the generous amount that they awarded us. The Museum feels indeed fortunate to have been awarded the money since revenues took a hit last year due to bad weather one of the two days of the show.

<u>January</u>

Motion to approve the 2015 Budget.

Motion to transfer \$50,000 from Treasury to our account at Fidelity Investments.

**February** 

Motion to move the April meeting to April 23.

March

Motion to elect Don Konen Chairman of the Board.

May

Motion to spend \$600 left over from the Meserve grant to buy new credit card machines that can read "chip" credit cards.

#### <u>June</u>

Motion to spend up to \$3,000 to move the new acquired bay window caboose from Albany to Danbury with money to come from the general fund.

E-mail and voice motion on June 6 to approve the purchase of the bay window caboose. See July.

#### July

Motion to ratify the voice/e-mail June 4 motion to purchase the bay window caboose.

Motion to ratify the voice/e-mail motion to purchase wire mesh grills for FA #617 (ex-NH) for \$3,000.

Motion to approve the revised Group Tour policy pricing.

displays in the Station as well as the model train layouts. When she saw the display of the O-gauge milk box and tank cars, she commented that she was instrumental in helping the milk industry trucking operations with a regulatory weight issue so that trucks could be operated at full capacity. Rep. Esty sits on the House Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines and Hazardous Materials. During their visit, Rep. Esty and Rep. Godfrey were updated on two major Museum projects: Saving the New York Central electric locomotives currently in the Albany area and the construction of a roundhouse next to the turntable.

The visit lasted almost an hour-and-a-half and Rep. Esty summed up her visit in one word - "Fantastic!"
