Ten Years Ago

Two new additions arrived in the yard, New Haven PS-1 Box Cars numbered 33732 and 34537. Both of these cars were purchased from a scrapper in New London, CT. Talk about timing. The scrapper was on site ready to start cutting them up awaiting our decision. Once the purchase was completed, arrangements were made with Lisi Towing to bring them to Danbury over the road on a flat bed trailer.

The Holiday Express to New York City was not as successful as past years but riders did have an enjoyable time. A New Haven Genesis engine was in the lead and the New York Central 3 was the last car in the consist. Plans and schedules were announced for the Easter Bunny Railyard Specials.

Work continued inside the station on the train layouts. The N-gauge layout of Danbury Yard saw the addition of the McCarthy Coal Company structure. This was built full-size and measured nearly 30 inches. Some scenery work was also completed. The S-gauge and O-gauge layouts continued to be popular with visitors. The G-gauge layout at the Galleria on Main Street also saw many visitors and had been dismantled for the season.

Plans were in the works for building a permanent HO-gauge layout in the station.

In addition to the layouts, a new display section was being constructed that would be used for photo and artifact exhibits. The first exhibit would be of some photographs taken by L. Peter Cornwall.

Work continued on installing new computers in the station. The first was for the Gift Shop where Patty Osmer and Kathie Fay stepped up to take over the day to day operation. A computer would be installed at the front desk along with a more welcoming counter.

Out in the yard, despite the cold weather, the Budd Car crew continued with restoration work on the inside of the car. John Geigle was appointed Head of Operations. He announced scheduled rules classes for anyone wishing to be involved with train operations.

nails to fasten the boards to the trusses, and we only bent nine nails (see photo 2). Dave Roberts planed the

end boards so they were flush with the fascia boards (see photo 3). The soffits were then installed using 160

screws. When completed the fascia boards and soffits were painted (see photo 4).

On December 3, 2011 the commercial roof was installed. Unfortunately, all the fine woodworking that was done was covered by the roof. We then installed the windows in the cupola and mounted the chimney (see photo 5).

To finish the cupola, fascia boards need to be installed. This will cover the flashing and seal the windows. It was decided to do this in the Spring of 2012. This entire project for the year took 875 hours.

Each time we worked on the roof, the tarps had to be removed and replaced at the end of the day. On average this was done twice a week. This tedious process took 190 hours of our time. During this time, three tarps failed to keep the water out and had to be replaced. This put a crimp in my budget. All this would not have been necessary if we had had a building to work in. Hopefully in the future, other projects will not have this problem.

Words from Our President

Goodbye 2011, welcome 2012. We hope you all had great holiday celebrations, family gatherings, and that the New Year is prosperous and full of successful resolutions.

In 2011 the DRM was a slight victim of the lackluster economy, but not quite as much as some of the federally funded larger national museums. Our attendance, income, and membership were down. Some of our events were slightly more successful than previous years, but we didn't set any records or achieve all of our goals. Financially, we are O.K.

Throughout the year we were able to accomplish a number of the goals/projects upon which we were working: 44-tonner 1399 operational, Pavilion #1 up, Pavilion #2 started, Catenary arches located to DRM yard, Roof installed on the New York Central caboose, Grant received from Amherst, Music video, Fashion shoot, Murder mystery movie, Wedding photo shoot, Night photo shoot with the Candlewood Camera Club, Great progress on the Tonawanda Valley; Baggage cart repaired, restored and displayed; Weaver estate grant received, 1455 progress on winterizing and window replacement; Repair of the control shed, decking and handrails on the turntable; New platform at the pumphouse, Hawley School outreach program; Shelton Library, New Fairfield and various other area outreach presentations, Speeder operational for use in trackwork, 3-piece diesel display lash-up in yard, Numerous donations (both financial and materials), New video security system with recorder in Museum building, Safety training; Tour guide, car host, conductor, and engineer training programs, Boy Scout merit badge program, and continued work on the Model layouts and exhibits within the Museum building. In addition, we ran our yearly events: Sweetheart trains, Bunny trains, National Train Day, Mother's Day, Owney the Post Office dog, Father's Day, Danbury Railway Day and Member picnic, Pumpkin trains, Santa trains, and a regular schedule of Tuesday library recording sessions, Tuesday modeling work/maintenance sessions, and Wednesday evening presentations. Numerous train shows around the state, Danbury Library display, and work with the Bethel Historical Society round out some additional ongoing projects the DRM continued running.
